POINTS TO REMEMBER

Here are some important rules from this calendar which are reiterated with a humble request for compliance. This will only help us focus better on the well being of our students

1. **Punctuality & Discipline** : Students should report to school on time, in proper and complete school uniform. More than three remarks of any kind will result in the student being sent home. **A student of A. M. Naik School should be dressed in proper and complete uniform whenever he or she steps into the school campus even if it is a holiday, weekly off, open house or any other activity.**
2. **Strictly Prohibited Articles** : **Strict disciplinary action amounting even to suspension or rustication will be taken if any student is found to be in possession of cigarettes, e-cigarettes, alcohol, tobacco or any kind of substance. The Principal's decision in this matter will be final.**

3. **Calls to School** : Avoid calling the school for information available on the MICM. Make your conversations brief. **No teacher/coordinator/HM will be connected on the telephone during the school hours, unless it is an emergency.**
4. **Communication with the school**: Always mention your ward's name, Grade and Division whenever you communicate with the school. In absence of the same, the communication may go unattended.

DO NOT send mails for:-

- a) **Leave** : Applying for leave unless it is a long leave and you are attaching a medical certificate. A calendar note may be sent. **Half day leaves are not permitted.** Similarly on stay back days, once the student has reported to school, he/she will not be permitted to go home early, unless there is an emergency. No exemption in the stay back activities will be given.
 - b) **Not Availing Bus Service** : Informing the school that your ward will not be availing the bus service on a particular day or to drop your ward in some other stop. Please refer to page no 55 of the bus rules for the procedure to be followed. Such mails will not receive any response.
5. **Unwell Students** : If your ward is unwell, please do not send him/her to school, even if there is a weekly test. In such cases the student will not be permitted to attend school and the parent will have to pick up their ward from the reception at the earliest. The student will be marked absent.
 6. **Tiffins, projects etc** : Do not send any tiffin, water bottle, projects or any kind of stationery etc. after your ward steps inside the school building. They will not be accepted owing to safety reasons. Tiffins sent with siblings or any other students in the afternoon batch will not be accepted.
 7. **Parent Pass** : Students will be handed over to parents or any authorised person only after producing the Parent Pass. Please carry the same for all events where you have to take custody of your ward.
 8. **Entry Pass** : An Entry Pass is issued to all parents for events like Annual Days, Sports Day etc. Keeping in mind that the seats are limited, this Entry Pass is for **2 ADULTS ONLY**. Which means only 2 Adults and no children in the age group of 3 years to 17 years (both inclusive) will be permitted. Babies in arms (below 2 years) are allowed to be seated on the parent's lap. **Day Care facility of the school @ INR. 1000/- per day may be availed for children in the age group of 3 to 17 years during such events.**

Code of Conduct

Every educational institution has its pre-defined 'Code of Conduct' based on conventional principles and expectations that are binding to the entire school cohort. It is established to foster the intellectual and civic development of students in a safe and secure learning environment, and to protect the core mission of the school. It includes rules and regulations which are a set of guidelines/instructions that help a school run smoothly and makes it a safe place where students learn in a nurturing environment. Students are responsible to the school authorities not only for their conduct in school, but also for their general behaviour outside as it reflects on the reputation of the school.

The following are the codes to be followed :

I. Attendance and Leave Policy

1. Students are expected to be punctual at all times. They must reach the school at least 5 minutes before the First Bell. More than three late marks in a month (or any other remark like improper uniform, unruly behaviour, etc) will result in student not being allowed to attend school for 1 day. On such instances the parent will have to come and pick up their ward from school at the earliest.
2. 100% attendance is appreciated and will be rewarded with a certificate.
3. **Minimum 75% attendance** is necessary for promotion to the next Grade.
4. The Principal has the authority to grant or reject a Leave Application.
5. In the event of a planned leave of **1 to 3 days**, a leave note has to be written on the 'Leave of Absence Record' page No 117
6. In the event of a **planned leave of more than 2 days**, an email should be sent clearly stating the reasons and uploading the medical certificate if needed.
7. In the event of an emergency, a leave application clearly stating the reason should be sent via email.
8. Students who remain absent without any intimation **for more than 15 days** are liable to have their names struck off from the roll.
9. **Half day leave is not applicable to students.** Requests for allowing students to leave school before dispersal time, after unit tests or on any other occasion will not be entertained. The student will be marked ABSENT and the weekly test marks will not be considered. It is mandatory for the students of the Secondary Section to stay after school, if present, for their activities on Mondays and Fridays. Students from the Primary Section will not be granted half leave once they are present in school.
10. If the student is unwell (**even during exams**), he/she will not be permitted to attend school. A mail attaching Medical and Fitness Certificate should be sent to school when the student resumes. The student will be given the exam paper to be solved at home for better understanding. Kindly note the marks will NOT be counted. This is to be STRICTLY FOLLOWED.
11. **The school does not provide any retest for class assignments, unit tests or any other examinations missed due to absence.**
12. Irregular attendance, habitual late coming, unjustified or unexplained absence of more than three days during the school term may result in strict disciplinary action.

13. Attendance on **the first and the last day of the School** for each term is mandatory. If a student is absent on the first or last working day, the student will not be permitted to enter the class without his / her parents meeting the Headmistress with a written letter giving valid reason for the absence.
14. Long leave for reasons **other than medical** will be granted once in 2 years and prior permission for the same will have to be sought, without which it would be considered as unauthorised leave.
15. Students, when unwell, should not be sent to the school. In the case of illness for more than 3 days, a written application / cover letter from the parent along with Fitness Certificate from a registered Medical Practitioner should be submitted to the Headmistress on the student's return to the school, failing which the student will not be allowed to attend the school.
16. The student will be responsible for completing the work missed during their absence. For this, the students / parents can check the class work and homework uploaded on the School Portal and in case of any query they can approach the Coordinator, Headmistress or Section Head of the respective section.
17. Discipline : Indiscipline of any kind like use of abusive language, fighting-physical or verbal, bullying, throwing water misbehaving with teachers & staff, housekeeping staff and fellow students, carrying any prohibited substance will not be tolerated. Strict disciplinary action will be taken by the school if any student is found indulging in such acts, which may include suspension or rustication from the school.

II. Medical / Psychological Test

1. After joining the school or at any time during the tenure of the student in the school, if the Academic Committee of the school feels he/she needs to undertake any tests like medical, IQ, Learning Disabilities, or any psychological evaluation or assessment, the parent would be requested to get it done and submit a report to the school's counseling department.
2. Based on the reports, the counseling department and the Principal will give their recommendations to the parents like appointing a **shadow teacher**, being a part of the ALP [Assisted Learning Programme] and so on. The parents are expected to abide by the same to help the student perform well. **Kindly note that all such information would kept confidential.**

III. School Calendar

1. Every student must be in possession of his/her calendar on every working day and while entering the school premises on any other given day.
2. Routine notices will either be sent through the student's calendar or will be displayed on the e-portal of the school. Parents are expected to check the calendar/e-portal every day and to take a note of any communications sent by the School.
3. Any communication to the school must be through the School Portal only. Telephonic communication will be entertained only in case of an emergency.
4. In case of loss/misplacement of the school calendar, a written application for a duplicate has to be sent to the Class Teacher. A charge of **Rs. 250/-** has to be paid through MICM for the issuance of a new school calendar.

IV. Identity Card

1. An ID card will be issued to all students and the same should be worn at all times while on the school premises and in the school bus.
2. In case of loss/misplacement of ID Card, Parent Pass or Exit Pass a written application for a duplicate has to be sent to the Class Teacher. A charge of **Rs. 100/-** has to be paid through MICM for the issuance of a new ID Card, Parent Pass or Exit Pass.
3. Two Parent Passes will be issued to the parents/guardians of the student. Students leaving the campus will be allowed to leave only with the person furnishing the Parent Pass. Parents of Grades 6 to 10 who wish their wards to leave the school unescorted, will be issued an Exit Pass for which the parent will have to send a written application to the school.
4. Due to security reasons, parents/guardians are prohibited from entrusting the Parent Pass to unauthorised persons and/or frequently changing their ward's escort.

V. School Uniform

1. The School Uniform reflects respect for the institution and brings in uniformity amongst the students of the school. Students are expected to dress neatly in the uniform prescribed by the school whenever they are in the school campus and when they visit the school during vacations / sale of books / open house etc.

2. Personal hygiene and cleanliness must be maintained at all times and students must be well groomed at all times.
3. Nails should be neatly trimmed and **hair must be cut short (crewcut) in the case of boys and neatly braided two plaits or pony tails with black ribbons in the case of girls (doubled up in case of long hair). Girls with short hair should wear a black hair band.**
4. Girls must use only black coloured cotton bands and ribbons with two pony tails or plaits. Girls with more than shoulder length hair should double up the plaits.
5. Fancy hair styles or braids, hair colouring or any other accessories which are not part of the school approved uniform are not permitted.
6. No jewellery or accessories or thread other than those mentioned under "School Uniform" like belt, socks, hair bands, black ribbons are permitted.
7. Application of mehndi, hair colour, makeup, kajal, lipbalms, nail paint is not permitted under any circumstances.
8. Students from Jr. KG. and Sr. KG. should necessarily deposit one full set of labelled clothes with the Class Teacher on the first day of school to be used in case the uniform gets soiled. The set needs to be replaced if it is used.
9. Students must be in their proper and complete school uniform from head to toe including footwear and hair whenever they enter the school premises on any working or non working day for Activity/Competition/Special Class/Open

House/Any Function/Book Sale or accompanying parents during PTA meetings.

VI. BIRTHDAY CELEBRATIONS

1. Children till Grade 2 are permitted to come to school dressed in casual wear, befitting the school environment.
2. **Stationery items / chocolates not exceeding INR. 30/- each should be sent for class distribution. Any gifts found above INR. 30/- will not be accepted and the same will be returned.**
3. Sending special gifts for teachers or staff members is strictly prohibited. The items as sent for distribution in the class may be shared with teachers and staff.
4. Sending birthday cakes, distributing invitations for birthday parties, exchange of gifts and such other activities are not permitted within school premises.

VII. SCHOOL OUTINGS

1. The School will be arranging for field trips, one-day picnics, overnight picnics etc. during the course of the year.
2. The details of the trip will be intimated to the parents along with a 'Consent Letter' that needs to be signed by both parents. The 'Consent Letter' is mandatory for the student to be a part of the trip.
3. Payment for the trip has to be made through the e-portal of the school or to the tour operator as the case may be on the scheduled date. **Any request for the extension of date will not be considered.** Any request / Emails for accepting payment after the due date will not be entertained or acknowledged.
4. Students who have paid for the trip and **submitted the duly signed 'Consent Letter'** will be considered eligible to join the trip. Payment of money without the Consent Letter will not entitle the student to be a part of the trip/excursion.
5. Kindly take a considered decision before enrolling your ward for the trip. No waiver of cancellation charges will be considered. Refund for cancellation, if any, will be initiated only after the students return from the trip.

VIII. MANDATORY EXTERNAL EXAMINATIONS :

1. The Academic Committee has identified the following external examinations to be beneficial for our students. Hence these exam are mandatory for the all students as per details given below.

Grade	Examination
6 and 9	Dr. Homi Bhabha Exam
3 to 9	Ei Asset Exam (Any one subject. Maths compulsory)
7 to 10	Elementary and Intermediate Art Exam
10	Career Counseling by Young Buzz @ 2400 per student

Any external exam unless compulsory will be conducted after the school hours.

IX. GENERAL RULES FOR STUDENTS:

1. All students and staff members are expected to speak in English while on the school campus.
2. Students are expected to maintain a high standard in their general behaviour and manner of speech.
3. Students should always walk to their left in a single line when they are in the school premises.
4. Attentiveness in class and regularity in homework and assignments are of prime importance.

5. **Copying during the weekly test or any exam is a grave offence. If any student is found copying during the weekly test or any exam, no marks will be accorded to the said student and also to the student who has helped in copying. The Principal's decision in this matter will be final. No emails or personal meeting for this matter will be entertained.**
6. If any student is found in possession of firecrackers, water pistols, periodicals, magazines, posters, pictures or books which do not belong to the curriculum or school, he/she will face strict disciplinary action for violating the school disciplinary rules.
7. **Strictly Prohibited Articles** : Strict disciplinary action amounting to suspension or rustication will be taken if any student is found to be in possession of cigarettes, e-cigarettes, alcohol, tobacco or any kind of substance. The Principal's decision in this matter will be final.
8. The School strongly discourages parents from enrolling their wards for tuitions. Private tuition in any subject undertaken by any member of the school staff is forbidden and can result in the student and staff both facing strict disciplinary action.
9. Students are not expected to take part in any political activity.
10. If any student is found in possession of mobile phones, CDs, computer games, I-pods or any sharp object while they are at school or in school uniform, the school will confiscate the same and will return it to the parent after the student has passed out of the school or left the school. The School would not be held responsible for any loss or damage to the article while in the possession of the school.
11. Students publishing articles having any reference to the school should take prior written permission from the Principal.
12. Incidents of theft will be dealt with on a case-to-case basis and wilful thieving will lead to suspension from School for a decided period. Vandalism will be dealt with strictly. The cost for damage to School property will be borne by the defaulters.
13. Students of the whole class will be held responsible for the cleanliness of their classroom.
14. While participating in Inter-School Competitions, students should be in the School Uniform unless instructed by the school and must carry enough food and water.
15. It is mandatory for the Students to carry a table napkin to be placed under their tiffin box before having their food during the breaks.
16. Tiffin, Snack Box, Water Bottle or Projects will not be accepted from any Parent/Guardian after the commencement of the classes or any time during the school working hours, even for medical reasons.
17. No student will be exempted from games/physical education unless a Medical Certificate stating the reason with the specified period of exemption is submitted to the Principal.
18. Students should ensure that their shoes are labelled with their name. The school staff will not help any student find any loss property. Students should untie their shoe laces and remove their shoes before entering the Music Room, Dance Room & Computer Lab or any other carpeted room when advised by the teachers to do so. The footwear should always be placed on the shoe rack, in the block bearing the roll number.

X. LOST PROPERTY

1. Any items like jackets, tiffin boxes, water bottles etc. misplaced by the student can be looked for on the ground floor, Atrium, next to the Cafeteria.
2. Students of the primary and secondary section can claim their lost property during lunch break or after school hours. For students of Elementary Section, parents can claim the lost property during the PTM.
3. No requests / emails for lost property will be acknowledged or entertained.
4. **All such items, if not claimed by the end of the month will be sent for charity, on the first of the succeeding month.**

XI. GENERAL RULES FOR PARENTS / GUARDIANS

1. Parents/Guardians are expected to be formally dressed while visiting the school. Shorts, Bermuda, Three Fourth Pants, Mini Skirts are not permitted.
2. Parents/Guardians should direct any concerns that they may have to the HM/Section Head/Principal.
3. Letters should be addressed only to the Principal and should mention the name of the Student, Grade and Division in which their child is studying. Any communication without the student's name, grade and division will be treated as anonymous and will not be attended to.
4. Parents/Guardians are not allowed to go to the class or meet the facilitators during school hours.
5. Parents are requested to inform the school immediately, in case of a change of address or telephone number through email as well as through the e-portal of the school
6. Parents should ensure that students do not bring any valuable items to school.
7. Any amount of money specified by the school must be sent to the Class Teacher in a sealed envelope with the name of the Student, Grade, Division and Roll No. clearly mentioned on it.
8. Any written communication to the school, must be enclosed with a Covering Letter, the format of which is given on page number 142.
9. Whenever the students are taken for picnic, field trips, competitions and so on, parents are requested to contact the Security Desk at the school half an hour prior to the informed time to confirm the exact time of arrival. Alternately you may check for the update from the PTA member.
10. The Principal's written permission is required for the following:
 - a) To make a collection for any purpose.
 - b) To arrange for a party, a picnic or a meeting in the School Premises.
 - c) To join Sports Meet or participate in games not arranged by the School.
 - d) To join a modelling assignment or showcasing our uniform in any media / advertisement.
11. Parents are advised not to discuss any queries with the teacher during arrival and dispersal. Parents can meet the teacher personally during the open forum scheduled on the working Saturdays (schedule given on Page No. 73)
12. Any medication to be administered after the student come to school will not be accepted after the school commence. The medicine should be given in the morning or sent with the student with clear instructions regarding dosage.
13. The school does not encourage the concept of half working day. No mails, phone calls and calendar notes should be sent requesting the same. Stayback is compulsory on Mondays and Fridays upto 3:30 p.m. from Grades 6 to 10.
14. Application for leave should be sent through an email clearly stating the name your child Grade, Division and reasons for the leave. In absence of the name of your ward, the email will be treated anonymous.
15. **Parents are requested to ensure that their wards are present for all Annual Day / Sports Day practice as per the schedule given by the school.**
16. **The dates for the class photographs are mentioned in the school calendar. It is important for the student to be present on that day in neat and complete, regulation uniform. In case the student is absent, he/she will miss being a part of the class photograph.**

2. Mode of Payment and Acknowledgement:

- The school will not accept any fee payment in cash.
- Payment of fees is to be done online through e-portal using parent login. After logging into Edusprint, click on the Account Tab, select fee payment option and proceed.
- Online fee payment can be done at any time throughout the year, in advance or after the due date but in the latter case, it needs to be paid along with a late fee fine.
- Payment details will get updated in School Management software and will be available on e-portal for parents reference.
- A consolidated fee receipt for the year will be issued in February to all parents for the tax purpose.

3. Late Fee Fine:

Late Fee Fine for the delay in payment of school fees will be calculated at the rate of Rs. 50/- per day of delay and will be calculated from the last date scheduled for Fee Payment for the respective quarter.

4. Default in Payment of School Fees

- The Tuition Fees determined by the School shall be binding on all students enrolled with the school and the fees for each term shall be paid in full on or before the due dates ("Due Date") as specified above.
- Failure to pay the Tuition Fees by the Due Date shall constitute an "Event of Default" and will, apart from Late Fee Fine, also attract strict penalty if the default is for a prolonged period.
- The School reserves the right to withhold the Leaving Certificate till all dues are cleared.

5. Bank Charges for Online Transactions

Certain bank charges will be applicable for online transactions and are subject to changes as per bank rules. Presently, the charges are as follows:

Rules for Students during the Academic Term:

1. Library services are available to all students during school hours and on Saturdays (except on holidays) between 9 a.m. and 12 noon.
2. During vacations, students may borrow books and use the library facility between 9 a.m. and 12 noon on weekdays.
3. Students need to be in complete school uniform, wear their ID card, carry the school calendar and a pen while visiting the library at all times.
4. The reference & periodicals (newspapers & magazines) collection is available for browsing during school hours.
5. Students may borrow one book at a time from the library for 15 days.
6. Books may be issued/returned during the library period or during long breaks for students of Grades 3 to 12.
7. **Rs. 5** per day will be charged if the book is not returned within 15 days from the date of issue. Students of Jr. KG to Grade 2 are exempted from paying library fines for late book returns.
8. Fine due, if any, will be accepted during short breaks for Grades 3 to 12.
9. Library services may be revoked for a stipulated period if a student continuously defaults on book returns or for behavioural issues.
10. Books returned in damaged condition may attract a fine or may be required to be replaced. The librarian will take the final call and has the authority to decide the fine amount.
11. Books misplaced/lost need to be replaced by the student.
12. It is the responsibility of the student to handover the book to the librarian while returning the book. If it is returned directly to the shelf without being updated on the online system, the book will be considered misplaced.
13. Library books should be returned by April 20th of every calendar year, and clear any pending fines.
14. During the stock-taking process, library services and collections will not be available to students.
15. Students may join the book club after submitting the consent letter signed by the parents as per the given format in the calendar.
16. Requests for photocopies of question papers of previous years will be accepted for Grades 6 to 12. Students will fill in the requirement in the 'QP request register', sharing details such as exam year, subject, grade and type of exam.
17. Weekly question papers of previous years will be charged at Rs. 5 per paper. All other papers will be charged at Rs. 25 per paper.
18. Question paper requests received during the week will be photocopied on Saturdays, and students may collect the same on Tuesdays during the long break.

Library Access for Parents:

1. Parents may avail library facilities on Saturdays between 9 a.m. and 12 noon during the academic year (except on holidays).
2. Please carry the Parent Pass during your visits.

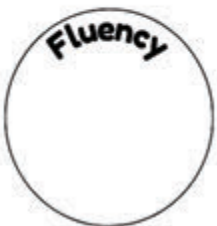
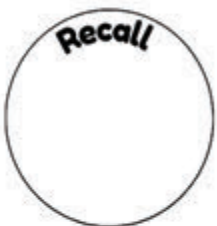

Rules for Students during vacations:

1. The Library will be open for students between 9:00 a. m. and 12 noon from Monday to Friday during vacations.
2. Students wanting to use the library facility during the vacations need to be in regular school uniform and bring their **Identity Card** along with them.
3. Students are requested to carry their calendar when they visit the library.
4. Issuing of books will not be possible during the stock taking period, but students can refer to books in the library itself. Once the stock taking is complete, it will be updated on the school portal and students can avail of the Book Issue Facility again.

Rules for Parents:

1. Parents may visit the library on Saturdays between 9:00 a.m. and 12 noon.
2. The library will be open for parents between 9:00 a.m. and 12 noon from Monday to Saturday during vacations.
3. The library will remain closed on all school and public holidays.
4. Parents are requested to carry their Parent Pass while visiting the library.

ARRIVAL & DISPERSAL NORMS:

1. Students who need some mode of transport to reach the school, are advised to avail of the school bus facility.
2. As a civic responsibility we do not recommend use of private cars unless used for car pooling.
3. Keeping in mind the safety of our students, use of private vans is not recommended nor authorised by the school.
4. During arrival, parents will have to handover their wards to the school staff who will be on duty at the designated area within the school premises, near the main gate.
5. During departure, parents will have to show their Parent Pass to the security staff while entering the school premises.
6. Class Teachers or trained housekeeping staff of the Elementary Section will escort the students to the pre-assigned places.
7. Parents are requested to approach the dispersal area in a disciplined manner, show their Parent Pass and collect their wards.
8. Verification of Parent Pass before handing over of the student will be carried out till Grade 10.
9. Students from Grade 6 to 10 who wish to exit without an escort will do so by producing the exit pass which will be issued to them on receiving a request from their parents .
10. Students coming to school on two wheelers must compulsorily wear helmet for both the rider and the pillion rider. Parents and students are requested to strictly adhere to this guideline to ensure the safety of our parents and students.

POLICY DURING UNPRECEDENTED RAINS

- In case of heavy rains during the night, if the Management decides to keep the school closed on the subsequent day, the message for the same will be sent to all parents through MICM latest by 6:30 a.m.
- Please check the Edusprint App in such cases rather than calling the school as the school lines may be jammed.
- In case it rains heavily during the night or day and if you fear water clogging in your area, you may at your own discretion decide not to send your ward to school.
- In case of severe flooding please be assured that your ward is safe in school, and you need not venture out and put yourself at risk. Our staff will be here till the last child is picked up by the parents.
- However, if the flooding does start during the day & you wish to come and pick your ward from school, you will be permitted to do so. However, only in case of heavy downpour.

HEALTHY EATING HABITS

1. A school plays a vital role in setting the right eating pattern and promoting a healthy choice of food.
2. Healthy eating habits are the stepping stone towards developing a healthy lifestyle. It is essential that these habits and values towards choosing the right kind of food must be inculcated at an early stage in life to ensure better food choices by them.
3. Tiffin should include healthy food like roti subzi, dosa, idli etc.
4. Long break tiffin should have healthy and filling items such as roti and sabzi, vegetable pulao, idli, parathas, etc. Whole wheat noodles and pasta with vegetables, sandwiches made of whole wheat bread and such items can also be sent.
5. Short break tiffin can include items like wheat bread sandwich, vegetable cutlets, idli, dhokla and other such items.
6. We prefer students to get home cooked food but the school also has a cafeteria which will provide hot, nutritious food to students from Jr. KG to Grade 10.
7. Aerated drinks will not be allowed within school premises, nor will it be permitted in the school cafeteria.
8. It is mandatory for students to carry their lunch boxes with them or avail the cafeteria facility. **Parents or dabbawalas will not be permitted to deliver lunch to school.**
9. Suggestions for menu for the Elementary Section will be shared with the parents. Parents are requested to adhere to the same.

CAFETERIA

1. Healthy and hygienic meals are available for our students from Nursery to Grade 10. Parents may subscribed for the meals (Breakfast/Lunch/Breakfast and Lunch) for their wards on a half yearly basis. The payment tab for the same is available on our e-portal.
2. No payment will be accepted after the due date. No emails for extension will be entertained or acknowledged.
3. Students of the Elementary Section who have subscribed for Saanvee Hospitalities will receive the food in their respective classroom. Students of the Primary and Secondary Section will receive the food in their respective floors.
4. The school believes in 'Zero Wastage Policy'. Students are requested to take only as much food as they can consume.
5. **Sharing of food by the registered students of Saanvee Hospitalities is Strictly Prohibited.**
6. Meals on subscription basis is not mandatory.

RULES FOR THE SCHOOL CAFETERIA

The school cafeteria is an essential part of almost every student's school life. This is a place for students to unwind, relax and recharge their energy with healthy and wholesome meals. Setting of rules for the cafeteria is only to enhance our student's experience here.

1. **Seating** : The sitting area of the cafeteria can accommodate limited students. Only students who regularly buy their meals from the cafeteria are permitted to sit in the cafeteria during the breaks. Students who carry their tiffin from home are requested to be seated in their respective classroom and enjoy their meal with their peers.
2. **Queue** : Maintaining a proper queue will help the cafeteria staff feed everyone on time.
3. **Noise** : Everyone chatting, laughing and eating their food in a relaxed manner is just the way a school cafeteria should be. However, sometimes it can get uncomfortably loud. This will be addressed by a nearby teacher or staff from the cafeteria.
4. **No wastage policy** : Wastage of food is not permitted. Students should buy only what they can consume.
5. **Cash dealings** : Parents should refrain from sending large amount of cash with their wards for the cafeteria. The school or cafeteria staff will not be responsible for any loss of money.
6. Loitering in the cafeteria after school hours is not permitted. If any student misses his/her school bus on this account, the parent will have to come to the school and take their ward.
7. Students of Grade 11 and 12 are not permitted to carry their mobile phones to the school cafeteria. They should carry cash for any payment to be made in the cafeteria.
8. **Credit Facility** : It will be extended to students only under the following circumstances:
 - a) **If the student has forgotten to carry his/her breakfast or lunch from home and does not have money to pay, the student will approach the class teacher, who will arrange for the student to be provided with the meal in the cafeteria.**
If a student approaches the food counter on the floor where food is provided for registered students and is refused food for any reason, they should reach out to the class teacher or coordinator immediately to resolve the matter.
 - b) Credit facility will be extended to the students only for breakfast/lunch and only on the recommendation of the teacher. No credit facility will be given for juice, muffins etc from the tuck shop.
 - c) The staff will note the amount payable and inform the parent.
 - d) Parents should send the amount with their ward the next day with a note for the class teacher.

All students and parents are requested to follow the rules for the smooth functioning of the cafeteria.

UNDERSTANDING THE SCHOOL BUS SYSTEM

The school does not have its own fleet of buses. However, for the convenience of the parents, the School has arranged for the bus service with Shree Ganesh Travels hereinafter called as Transporter. You may contact their helpline numbers given below or email transportdesk@shriganeshtravels.com. It is advisable for all students to use the bus service, except for those



who walk to School. This request is made taking into account the safety of students and to reduce the traffic congestion near the school. The school does not authorise any van service. Use of the van service is at the sole responsibility of the parents and the van driver.

Although the School has taken every care to ensure that the Transporter adheres to all the rules and regulations of the RTO, parents are requested to note that the school is only a facilitator between the parents and the Transporter.

3. Role of a Lady Attendant :

- The Lady Attendant's scope of work extends to the students only. She will facilitate smooth embarking and disembarking of students, specially the young ones.
- She will ensure that discipline is maintained in the bus. The students from Grade 3 onwards are responsible for their own behaviour. It should be the endeavour of every parent to educate their ward on the importance of discipline in the bus.
- The Lady Attendant will not receive or make calls to any parent to ensure that her attention is not deviated from the students.
- She is not authorised to listen or offer solutions to any grievances of the parent. The same should be directed to the Bus Supervisor or Manager or the school.

BUS FEES SHOULD BE PAID ONLY ON THE EDUSPRINT PORTAL. NO CASH, CHEQUE, QR CODE OR PAYMENT TO ANY OTHER ACCOUNT WILL BE CONSIDERED.

b) Late Fee Charges:

Parents are expected to pay the bus fees on time in order to help the Transporter run the buses smoothly. Late fee charge of **Rs.200/-per month** will be levied if the fees are not paid before the due date. Although a gentle reminder will be sent, it is the responsibility of the parent to pay the fees on time without waiting for reminders. **No waiver on the late fee charges will be considered and parents are requested not to approach the Transporter or the School for the same.**

If bus fees are pending for more than one month after the due date, the Transporter has the authority to discontinue the bus service to the student. Parents of Grade 10 students, kindly note that the bus fees have to be paid for the **full year** as per schedule given above. Parents are requested to check the portal for the status of fees paid. Please contact the transport desk if any discrepancies are found on the portal.

5) Rules and Regulations :

It is imperative that all concerned follow the rules and regulations to ensure smooth and safe ferrying of our students.

a) **Registration :** It is mandatory that once registered, the bus facility has to be used for the entire academic year. In case the bus facility is discontinued in the middle of the year, the bus fees will not be refunded. Requests for refund will not be entertained. Readmission in the next year is at the sole discretion of the Transporter. Mid term admission is permitted only for students who take admission to the school in between the terms.

b) Timings :

1. It is the responsibility of the parent to ensure that their ward reaches the stop 5 minutes before the scheduled time for pick up. Similarly, the parent or authorized person should be present at the stop 5 minutes before the scheduled drop time. **(Parent Pass is mandatory)**

2. The bus driver will not wait for any student if they are not at their stop on the scheduled time. In case the bus reaches earlier than the scheduled time during the pick up, the driver will wait till the scheduled time and then leave. The same applies for the drop. Parents are requested to keep a track of the bus on the GPS system and ensure that they are at the stop for pick up 5 minutes before the bus arrives.
 3. Similarly for the drop, in case no one is present to pick up the student (escorted students) at the scheduled time, the student will be brought back to school. The parent will then have to pick up their ward from the school at the earliest.
 4. No calls will be made or received by the lady attendant specially due to non-availability of the student at the stop during the pick up and non availability of the parent/authorised person during the drop time. Parents are advised not to chase the bus and call the didi for stopping the bus.
- c) No student will be permitted to board or disembark from the bus at any other stop than the one he/she is registered for. Parents are requested not to send applications for the same.
 - d) At no time are parents permitted to board the bus. Parents boarding the bus for reprimanding the student or taking pictures or video will be viewed seriously and disciplinary action amounting to suspension of the student from the bus service may be taken by the school.
 - e) **Parent Pass** : Parent pass is an important document which needs to be taken very seriously. The purpose of this pass is to ensure the safety of our students and avoid any risk of the student being handed over to any unauthorized person.
Parent Pass should be produced before the lady attendant hands over the student, even if the same person has been coming to pick up the child over a prolonged time.
Escorted students will not be handed over without the Parent Pass.
 - f) **Bus Service Not Required** : On any particular day if you do not wish your ward to avail the bus service on return and if you are going to pick up your ward from the school, the parent/authorised person should take custody of their ward **from the bus** after producing the parent pass to the bus didi. If any parent is reaching late for the pick-up, they should contact the transport department on the mobile numbers or through the school number and informed them about the same.

Parents are requested to pick up their ward from the bus after informing the bus didi and NOT from the reception. Any deviation from this procedure will be treated as violation of rules and may call for disciplinary action amounting to suspension from the bus service

In case you have dropped your ward in the morning and wish to him/her to avail the bus on the return, you should contact either on phone or message the Bus Supervisor or Bus Manager and inform them **well in advance** so that the bus didi ensures the child has boarded the bus on the return.

- g) **Discipline**: Indiscipline of any kind like use of abusive language, fighting - physical or verbal, bullying, throwing water, calling out to outsiders or throwing water out of the window, misbehaving with the bus didi etc will not be tolerated. Strict disciplinary action will be taken by the school if the students are found indulging in such acts, which may

include withdrawal of the bus facility for a specific period or permanently, depending on the nature of the misconduct. Such action may be taken without informing or warning the parents as we expect our students to be well behaved at all given time. Discipline is not restricted to students, but parents too. For any grievances parents are requested to approach the school for appropriate action. **At no time shall a parent step into the bus to reprimand either another student or the Lady Attendant or the driver. Parents are not permitted to click pictures or take videos of the bus or students. All concerns should be reported to the school.**

We are a school open to suggestions and also believe in giving a patient hearing to all grievances. Therefore, parents barging into the Front Desk with their grievance, creating a ruckus and using abusive and defamatory language for the school or transport staff members is not acceptable. This may result in withdrawal of the bus facility to the student.

- h) **Nodal Points** : Bus stops are based on the Nodal points as the school does not believe in doorstep pick up and drop as this will add to the total travel time taken by the students. Parents are requested to cooperate with the school in this regard. Also, since ours is a growing school, bus stops are liable to change year to year.
- l) **Bus Route** : Routes once set will not be changed during the academic year. However, in case of road repairs, festive pandals etc, the routes may be diverted and the parent will have to drop and pick the student at the nearest convenient point till the road is accessible. Parents are requested to cooperate at such times and not get into arguments with the bus didi or driver. In such a situation, it is the responsibility of the parent to drop the student at the nearest convenient stop. In case the student is in any day care, it is the responsibility of the parent to arrange with the day care to get the student dropped or picked up at the nearest convenient point for the bus.
- i) **Change in Residence** : In case there is change in the bus stop due to change in the residence, the same has to be informed to the school with relevant documents and the Transporter immediately.
- k) **Changes in the stop** : Temporary changes in the bus stop will not be encouraged and in case of an emergency, a mail should be sent to school stating reasons and only after approval of the school will the change be implemented. Constant change in the stop is a security hazard which the school will not accept.
- l) **Seating** : The school does not encourage any reservation of seats. We do permit students to mutually agree and decide where to sit. However, no student will ask another student to get up from an occupied seat.
- m) **Seat belts** : The bus didi will fasten the seat belt for the elementary students only once on boarding. Parents are requested to advice their wards not to remove the seat belt in the interest of their own safety.
- n) **Bus Badges** : No student will be permitted to board the bus without the bus badges on their uniform. In case you need more badges kindly procure the same from the transporter to ensure that every uniform bears the badge.
- 6) **Emergencies** : Keeping the safety and security of the students in mind, the school will not ply buses in the event of emergencies like bandh, floods etc. Parents are requested to

use their own discretion and decide whether they would like to drop/send their wards to school on such days. In case such a situation arises after the students are already in school, parents will have to personally pick their ward from school.

- 7) **Drop with/without escort** : Students from Jr. KG to Grade 5 will not be dropped without an escort on producing the Parent Pass. No student will be handed over to the watchmen or any unauthorised person unless a letter to this effect is given by the parent and approved by the School. The bus didi or driver will not help the students in crossing the road.

Students from Grade 6 onwards will be dropped off at their scheduled bus stop and can leave from there unescorted. It is their responsibility to board the bus on time. In case they are waiting after school hours for any activity, it is their responsibility to inform the bus didi about the same. In such cases buses will not wait for them and the student will have to take the next available bus or the parent will have to pick them up from the school.

- 8) **GPS SYSTEM** : We have tied up with CHAKRAVIEW for the GPS system. This tracking app will enable you to track the movement of the bus on your route only. The app also registers the attendance of your ward. It is mandatory for the student to wear the ID card daily for registering his/her attendance. You will receive messages once your ward has boarded the bus and also when your ward has disembarked. For any issues regarding this app please contact their helpline on 9820955544
- 9) **Bus service on national holidays** : The School Bus Service will not be available on National Holidays i.e 26th January and 15th August.
- 10) **Important messages** : Urgent and important messages like the school remaining closed due to heavy rains or sudden holiday declared by the Government, any delays etc. will be sent by the transporter via the Chakraview App.

It is very important for students and parents to follow the above rules to ensure happy and safe travel for our students.

We request all parents and students to extend decent courtesy to our lady attendants and drivers and treat them with respect. Any issues with them may be reported to the school for necessary action.

3. Admission for Jr. KG to Grade 2 will be based on lottery system followed by a personal interaction while admission to Grade 3 and above will be on the basis of marks scored in the Entrance Test for English, Second Language and Mathematics conducted by the school.

5. Admission to Grade 2 and above will be treated as Provisional Admission till the submission of Leaving Certificate / Transfer Certificate from the previous school is submitted to this school. The last date for submission of LC / TC is 30th June of the year of admission.
6. Students migrating from different Boards (other than ICSE) or from a different State or District need to have their Leaving Certificate counter signed by the Education Department of the concerned State / District / Board, if required by CISCE.

WITHDRAWAL POLICY

1. Application for Leaving Certificate / Transfer Certificate should be made in writing and should be signed by both the parents / guardian (whoever has signed the admission form).
2. Application for LC has to be made 30 days in advance before the actual date of withdrawal failing which, one months fee will have to be paid as notice fee.
3. LC will be issued only after all dues payable to the school are settled.

REFUND POLICY

Admission fees once paid are non-refundable under any circumstance.

For refund of Tuition Fee / Term Fee, please note that in case of new admission, if the parents put in a request for withdrawal of admission after the commencement of the session, the school will deduct the tuition fee for the period. This will include the month the notice is given in as well as one additional month's fee. In case of rollover students, if the parent has paid the fee for the term and there is a mid-term withdrawal, tuition fee for the period that the student has attended School including the month the notice is given as well as one additional months' fee will be deducted. If the student has attended even one day of school, term fee is not refundable. If the child has not attended school, term fee will be refunded along with the balance tuition fee.

In case the parent has not paid the fees, the school will withhold the Leaving Certificate till the dues as mentioned above are settled.

The Executive Committee will be responsible for collating the inputs received from all classes and discussing the same with School Management and only after discussing with the School Management, will disseminate the information / decision to all the parents.

The PTA Executive Committee will meet once every quarter, with prior intimation.

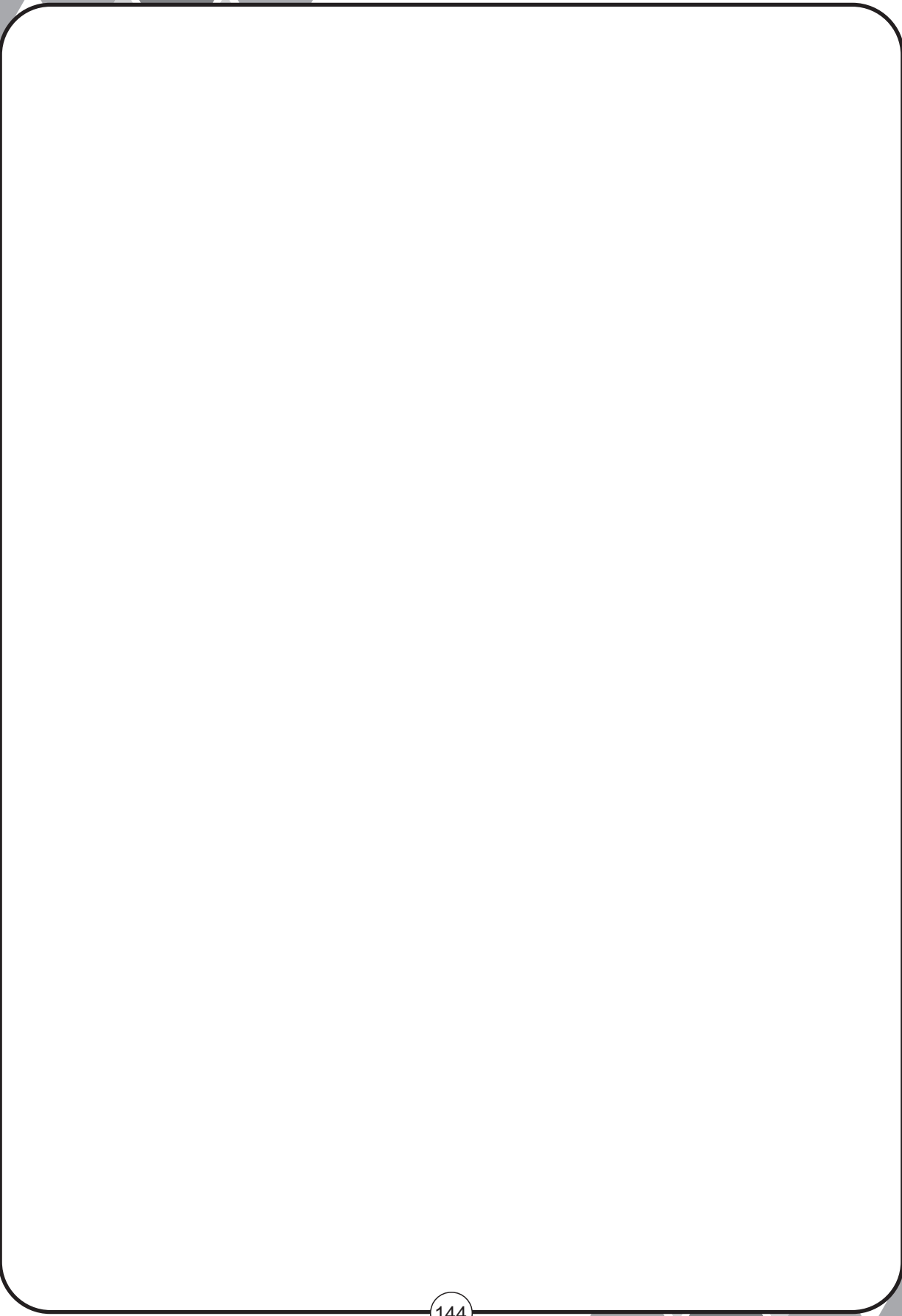
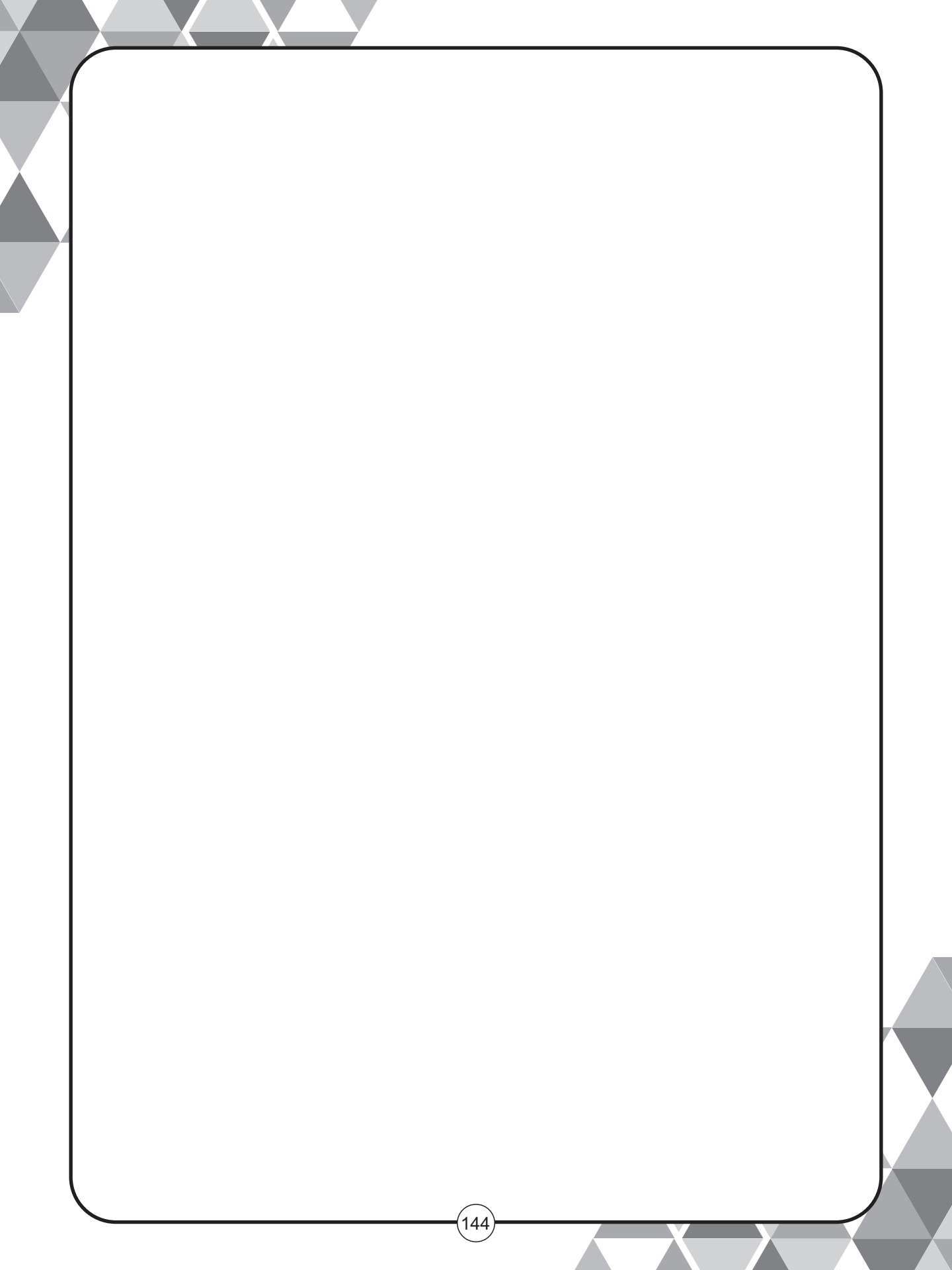

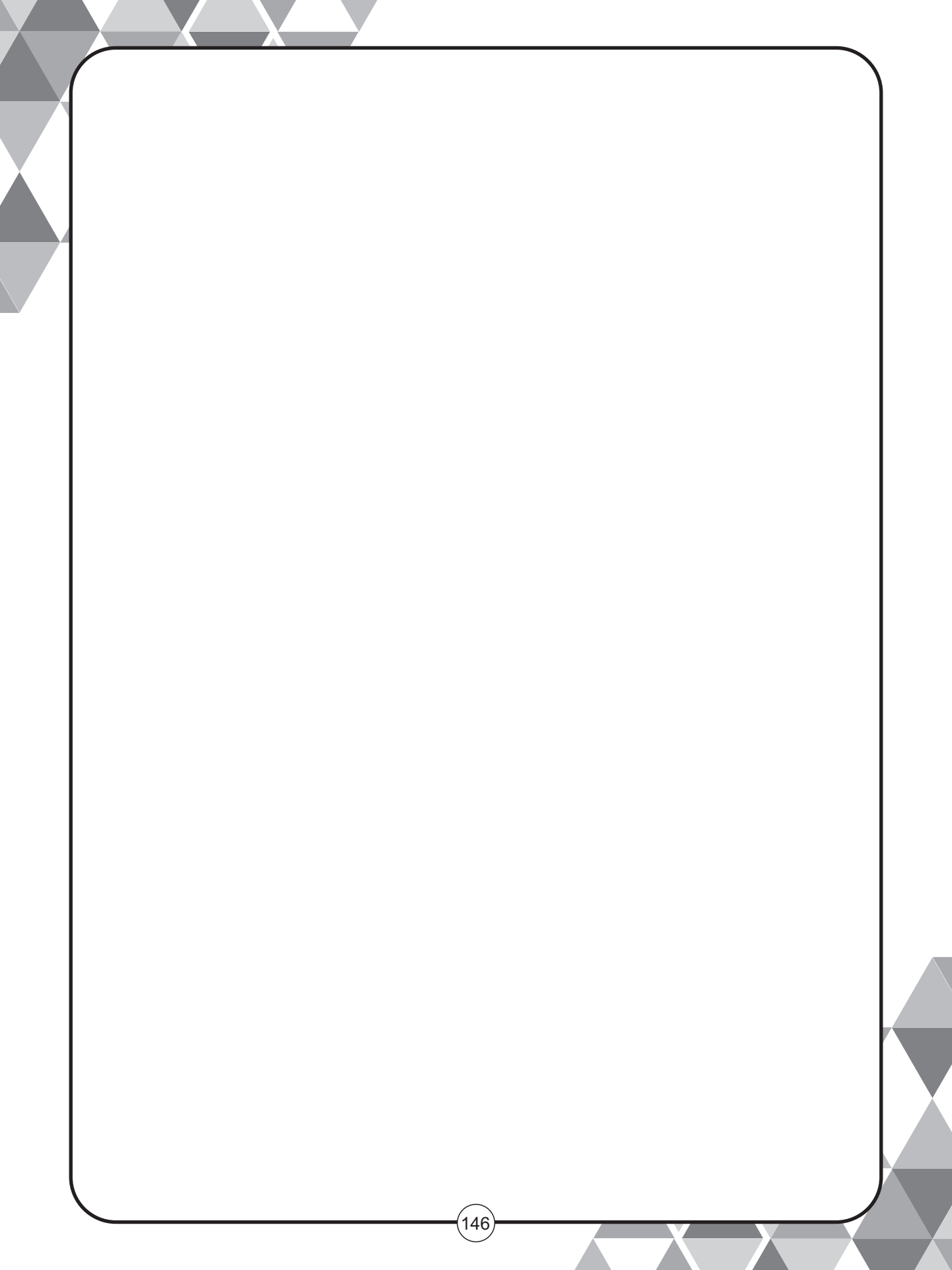
